

PROCLAMATION OF ELECTION



By We the People of the California State Republic, Established 1850

Part I — Proclamation of Intent

We, the people of the California State Republic, affirm that the original **California Constitution of 1849** was ratified at an election on November 13, 1849, prior to statehood in 1850.

We further note that a second constitution was drafted and adopted in 1879 following a constitutional convention, replacing the 1849 Constitution with a new governing charter narrowly approved by the voters.

We hold that the succession of constitutional amendments and government actions since 1879 has departed from the principles we believe were embodied in the California Constitution of 1849, particularly regarding republican governance with checks and balances. This has resulted in a state plagued with corruption, fraudulent elections, financial waste, illegal immigration and more.

Accordingly, we declare our intent to restore the foundational structure of a republican government reflected in the California Constitution of 1849. Under this proclamation, we assert that all amendments and later constitutions that followed the California Constitution of 1849 are nullified. We will hold a lawful general election on January 27, 2026, through voluntary, county-based assemblies we refer to as *jural societies*. The interim officers elected in this election will occupy the seats of the original California Republic under the California Constitution of 1849, and remain subject to future elections and ratification by the people of California Republic.

This election shall proceed in alignment with these foundational documents:

- Constitution for the United States of America (1787)
- Bill of Rights (1791)
- Declaration of Independence (1776)
- Proclamation of Claim and Interest of the Republic for the United States of America, Ozark, Alabama, April 30, 2012
- The Holy Bible
- California Constitution of 1849

Part II — 2026 General Election for Interim California Republic Governance

We the People of California have stood up 27 counties for the California Republic which is the number of counties established when the California Constitution of 1849 was ratified. These counties comprise approximately 85.2% of California's current population. We the people shall conduct a general election on January 27, 2026 to select interim officeholders to serve under the principles outlined in this proclamation. The prepared ballots will be distributed to members of the jural societies, including current interim placeholders, with completed ballots due on **January 27, 2026**.

This Election Notice to the People will be emailed to and posted in county-based jural societies two weeks in advance of the election. After the election, each county's jural society will report its results to the interim Secretary of State and in each county's jural society subgroup on our business forum = telegram. Results shall be publicly reported within two weeks after the election on the designated Public Notice channel, **TruthSocial.com/@carepublic**.

State Offices to Be Elected:

1. **Executive - Governor**

Following the election, the Governor shall appoint:

- Secretary of State
- Treasurer/Comptroller
- Attorney General

2. **Legislature**

- House of Representatives
- Two Senators

3. **Judicial**

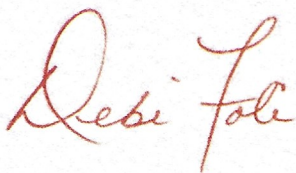
- Chief Justice and Associate Justices

- County Commissioners
- County Clerk
- County Justice
- County Court Clerk
- County Sheriff
- County Delegates

Part III — Future Constitutional Convention

We the People recognize that the California Constitution of 1849 did not address certain later-arising civil rights developments, including universal suffrage regardless of race or gender. Such matters, and other necessary reforms, shall be addressed in a future Constitutional Convention convened in accordance with the constitutional processes set forth in the California Constitution of 1849.
