ADDENDUM #1 – Covert Parts of the Plan

ADDENDUM #2 – EO 13848 – Imposing Certain Sanctions in the Event of Foreign Interference in a United States Election (2018)

- Although not a comprehensive governmental reform order, EO 13848 establishes a national-security framework for assessing and responding to foreign interference in U.S. elections. The Order requires intelligence and law-enforcement agencies to evaluate foreign election interference following each federal election and authorizes sanctions against foreign actors where appropriate.

- The Executive Order aligns with several RAP themes emphasizing constitutional government, national sovereignty, election integrity, and restoration through existing lawful institutions rather than revolutionary means.
- It therefore provides additional publicly documented evidence of an institutional approach to protecting constitutional processes

3. EO 13848 – Imposing Certain Sanctions in the Event of Foreign Interference in a United States Election (2018)

EO 13848 establishes a national security framework for identifying, assessing, and responding to foreign interference in United States elections. It requires post-election intelligence assessments by the Director of National Intelligence and coordinated reports by the Department of Justice and Department of Homeland Security, while authorizing sanctions against foreign actors responsible for election interference. Although narrower in scope than many of the Administration's later reform initiatives, the Order strongly aligns with RAP principles emphasizing constitutional government, national sovereignty, election integrity, accountability, and restoration through existing lawful institutions.
